This standard is an adoption and is identical to ISO 20022-4:2026(E) Financial services — Universal financial industry message scheme — Part 4:XML Schema generation profile for the implementation of ISO 20022-4: 2026(E) published by the International Organization for Standardization.

This document complements the ISO 20022 Metamodel, as specified in ISO 20022-1, with the XML syntax transformation rules to be applied by the ISO 20022 Registration Authority in order to translate an ISO 20022 compliant MessageDefinition into an XML Schema for the description and validation of XML Messages.

Where reference is made to informative and normative annexes the following definitions should be noted:

- Informative Annex – gives additional information intended to assist in the understanding or use of the document. They do not contain requirements.
- Normative Annex – gives provisions additional to those in the body of a document. They contain requirements.

Users should note that all standards undergo revision from time to time and that any reference made herein to any standard implies its latest edition, unless otherwise stated.

This standard is voluntary.
